Quarterly Commentary

Volatility and the Market

Following a first quarter that saw the S&P 500 set new records, the market started off with a quick pullback in April before continuing its record setting upward trajectory. The quarter started off with persistent inflation data and a higher-for-longer rates narrative providing a headwind. Following a rocky April, markets resumed their upward trend in May with a few mega cap names leading the charge. More than half of the upside in the S&P 500 during May came from just 4 mega cap stocks - namely Nvidia, Apple, Microsoft, and Alphabet – which helped the Tech sector gain 10% during the month. June saw a continuation of what we got in May, with mega caps pulling the index upward. While the S&P 500 saw over 15% upside through the first half of the year, the S&P Equal Weight was only up by about 5%.

Reviewing sector performance, the leaders for the quarter were Information Technology (+13.81%), Telecommunications (+9.38%), and Utilities (+4.66%). The worst performing sectors this quarter were Materials (-4.50%), Industrials (-2.90%), and Energy (-2.42%). With the mega caps driving a disproportionate amount of the upside in their sectors, Information Technology is up 28.24% year-to-date, closely trailed by Telecommunications which is up 26.68%.*

Looking back on economic data for the quarter, much of the economic data that came in was below expectations. We saw the unemployment rate tick up to 4% and continued disinflation. Expectations regarding the number of rate cuts this year fell throughout the quarter, with most market participants revising their expectations to just one rate cut in 2024.

Shelton Equity Income Strategy

During the second quarter, the Equity Income Portfolio underperformed the CBOE BuyWrite Index (BXM) by 0.16%, delivering a gross return of 1.33% compared to the BXM return of 1.49%. Year-to-date the strategy is still outperforming the BXM, delivering a gross return of 10.26% (9.51% net) compared to the BXM at 7.59%. The strategy generated 1.33% cash flow from option premiums and 0.41% from dividends during the second quarter, bringing the year-to-date cash flow up to 3.72% (3.01% net).

Our strongest performers this quarter were Apple Inc (AAPL), NetApp Inc (NTAP), Alphabet Inc (GOOGL), NRG Energy Inc (NRG), and Applied Materials Inc (AMAT). We continue to hold all of the above, though we have been selectively letting some shares be called away when deemed appropriate.

Our underperformers for the quarter were Fortinet Inc (FTNT), Cardinal Health Inc (CAH), Steel Dynamics Inc (STLD), Trimble Navigation (TRMB), and Lamb Weston Holdings Inc (LW). We continue to hold all of the above with the exception of STLD, which we have been transitioning out of the portfolio.

What We See Moving Forward

Moving into the second half of 2024, all eyes are on the Fed as the market tries to gauge how many rate cuts we will see this year, if any. The second half of the year will also bring the presidential election to the forefront, with market participants trying to position themselves as well as possible based on the expected policies of whichever administration ends up holding the reigns. Additionally, the geopolitical risks we have been watching this year have yet to abate and could add to market volatility. In a year with so much going on and the market repeatedly rallying to new record highs, we believe the Equity Income strategy is well positioned to take advantage of, and capitalize on, the volatility and uncertainty.
